HR 111/HCR 131, Requesting the Convening of a Working Group to Review the Duties and Responsibilities of the Agribusiness Development Corporation and Make Recommendations to Improve the Corporation's Efficiency and Programs to Better Address Current and Future Agricultural Issues

Chair Tsuji and members of the Committee on Agriculture, thank you for the opportunity to testify on HR 111/HCR 131, which requests the convening of a working group to review the duties and responsibilities of the Agribusiness Development Corporation and make recommendations to improve the corporation's efficiency and programs to better address current and future agricultural issues.

Seventeen years ago when the Agribusiness Development Corporation (ADC) was established, Hawaii's agriculture was transitioning from sugar and pineapple plantations to diversified crops. The transition has been virtually completed, and there is a different set of issues facing agriculture today. These issues place greater focus on land, water, biosecurity, food safety and security, and other issues. Within this context, the ADC can play a critical role in advancing Hawaii's agriculture, particularly in serving as the interface between public and private sectors and streamlining processes within the government to achieve positive agricultural outcomes.
