Pursuant to S.C.R. No. 87, S.D.1, the University of Hawai'i (UOH) and the Hawai'i Department of Education (DOE) submit the following information.

Based upon most current data on course offerings within the University of Hawai'i (UOH) and the Hawai'i Department of Education (DOE), English as Second Language (ESL) is proportionally one-third to one-half of the number of courses classified as Hawaiian Language (HAW).

Based upon this data, proportionally more resources are committed to Hawaiian Language courses than to English as Second Language courses.
