Nomination of Theodore E. Liu (GM 269)

Chairs Fukunaga and Nishihara, and Members of the Committees:

I support the nomination of Theodore E. Liu as Director of the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism.

Over the past four years, Mr. Liu's vision of economic development for the State of Hawai'i has encouraged active collaboration between state government and the University of Hawai'i's ten campuses. DBEDT initiatives have been notably congruent with those of the University, particularly in the development of a technologically capable workforce in a global marketplace.
