SCR 53 REQUESTING COLLABORATION AMONG VARIOUS STATE AGENCIES TO IDENTIFY AND REMOVE BARRIERS RELATING TO WORKFORCE DATA SHARING AND NURSING PRACTICE IN THE STATE.

Chairs Baker and Hee, Vice Chairs Green and Shimabukuro, and members of the Senate Committees on Commerce and Consumer Protection, and Judiciary and Labor, thank you for this opportunity to provide testimony in strong support of SCR 53. This measure requests that the Hawai'i State Board of Nursing (BON), Professional and Vocational Licensing Division of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs (PVLD), Department of the Attorney General work with the Hawai'i State Center for Nursing (Center for Nursing) to:
