## Request for Exemption from 103D, HRS Oracle Managed Database Services

(1) Explanation describing how procurement by standard competitive means is either not practicable or not advantageous to the University

The University currently utilizes Oracle enterprise program licenses for its database management. Moving forward, the University would like to procure Oracle's managed database services via the Oracle cloud at customer's premises ("Oracle's managed database services"). Oracle's managed databased services would include the enterprise program licenses currently utilized by the University and provide additional services managed by an Oracle operational team on a dedicated server and storage platform.

The licenses that the University currently utilizes that would be included in Oracle's managed database services is considered a pre-approved sole source under Subchapter 9, Sole Source Procurement, Section 3-122-81, General Provisions, Hawaii Administrative Rules. These licenses are proprietary to Oracle. In addition, Oracle's managed database services are proprietary to Oracle. As such, procurement by standard competitive means is not practicable or advantageous to the University.

(2) <u>Details of the process or procedures to be followed in selecting the vendor to ensure as</u> fair and open competition as practicable

Since it has been determined that procurement by standard competitive means is not practicable or advantageous to the University, the University is proposing to negotiate directly with Oracle to procure Oracle's managed database services.

Oracle has provided the University with a proposal that provides for a proprietary solution that would currently replace the University's escalating annual database maintenance fees with a full provisioned managed solution at the current ITS data center. Oracle's proposal includes purchasing its managed database services through the Midwestern Higher Education Compact (MHEC) agreement with Oracle. The University is currently a member of the Western Interstate Commission of Higher Education (WICHE). Members of WICHE have been afforded the opportunity to purchase Oracle's software licenses and services through its alliance with MHEC. The agreement between MHEC and Oracle affords MHEC and WICHE members the ability to purchase Oracle software licenses and services, including Oracle's managed database services.

This solution will provide the University with a reduction in direct database maintenance costs, while increasing performance, reducing the manpower load (Information Technology Service [ITS] resources), providing a significantly greater degree of redundancy and security, and delivering a net decrease in the University's cost of ownership. The solution would increase the University's ability to utilize the full Oracle database suite without any increase in expenditure and reduces ITS resources required to support the set of existing enterprise application systems.

Furthermore, ITS has fully vetted Oracle's proposal with other representative commercial customers and is working in parallel with other larger higher education systems in acquiring the Oracle managed database services. ITS has taken initial steps to expose

the possible alternative pieces of the solution to competitive pricing, e.g., server and storage elements, price comparisons of the incremental Oracle products licensed. ITS has also conducted informal Gartner inquiries on the pricing and total cost of ownership of Oracle's proposal and found solid results based on the offerings by Oracle to date. Once this approach is approved, ITS will take additional pricing competitive measures to further reduce the final costs to the University and ensure that the university has appropriate pricing and performance guarantees in place.

(3) A description of the Department's internal controls and approval requirements for the exempted procurement

The Director of Technology Infrastructure and his staff will directly control the review and technical approvals of all deliverables. The Director of Administrative Services and the Vice President for Information Technology and Chief Information Officer will further review the overall processes, and vet the final proposal/solution with the University's peers.
