William F. Haning, III, M.D., DFASAM, DFAPA (“Bill”)
Biography (21 December 2017)

Bill Haning is the elder of two children born to William Frees Haning, Jr., and Kathleen Haning; his remarkable sister is Michele Ryan, a banker. The senior Bill Haning was a farmer, a laborer, a professional rodeo rider, and finally a schoolteacher who later hoped to teach in Hawai`i. He was also an Army Air Corps Reservist, a P-40 pilot, who was called to active duty at Wheeler Airbase one month before the beginning of World War II; his next island home was New Guinea. Kathleen was a clerk in the Australian Ministry of Defense when the two met. The younger Bill relocated from school in Sydney, Australia, to Hawai`i in 1965. A scholarship kid at Punahou, he had never experienced anything so exhilarating, so like an educational Disneyland. It took him a few years to realize that not everyone in Hawai`i had the same educational experience, and he wonders to this day why that should be the case; he is convinced that it should not be.

His school friends in Hawai`i became and remained his closest friends through life, and were the basis for his remaining a resident through college and several careers. He is now a former tenured Professor of Psychiatry at the John A. Burns School of Medicine, University of Hawai`i, having served as the Director of M.D. Programs for the medical school until his retirement in August. He continues to direct addiction psychiatry and addiction medicine residency training programs and to participate in non-compensated clinical instruction and research. A Director of the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) and the Editor-in-Chief of the *ASAM Weekly*, he also serves as Chair of the Examination Committee for Addiction Psychiatry, American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN). His bachelor's degree in Philosophy was from Princeton University and his M.D. was from the University of Hawai`i at Manoa, JABSOM, in its first graduating class; he remains in service to both high school and university. He is a Member of the American College of Psychiatrists, a Distinguished Fellow of the American Society of Addiction Medicine and a Distinguished Fellow of the American Psychiatric Association.

None of these were expected outcomes; even survival has been in doubt on occasion, and Bill has been very fortunate. He is certified in Psychiatry, Addiction Psychiatry, and Addiction Medicine; has received teaching awards inclusive of the APA's Nancy C.A. Roeske Certificate, the John M. Hardman Award for Mentorship from the John A. Burns School of Medicine of the University of Hawai`i, the Leonard Tow Humanism in Medicine Award, the Judge James S. Burns Award for community service, and the University of Hawai`i Regents' Medal for Excellence in Teaching. In 2014, the Hawai`i Medical Association designated him Hawai`i's Physician of the Year. The Force Surgeon (2001-2007) for both U.S. Marine Forces Pacific and for Marine Forces Central Command in Operation Iraqi Freedom, Bill served subsequently as the Division Psychiatrist, 4th Marine Division, retiring in 2009; his awards include the Legion of Merit.

He spends a lot of time trying to defeat age through exercise, which seems only to wear him out; and an equal amount of time trying to understand humanity by reading history, which only raises more questions. He lives in Manoa Valley in Honolulu where he is the undeserving spouse of the extraordinary Dr. Libby Char. His aim in retiring this year was explicitly to be of use: retirement is the ultimate form of tenure, providing the luxury of identifying and serving where best qualified to serve. He understands that, aside from family, service as a Regent will require precedence over all other activities.
