

Call for Papers

Dear Colleagues and SIG-REAPA Members of the AERA:

You are cordially invited to submit your research paper for the third volume of a series sponsored by the SIG-Research on the Education of Asian and Pacific Americans (REAPA) of the American Educational Research Association to be published by Information Age Publishing, Inc. Your research paper must address the unique educational issues of Asian and Pacific American students in k-college. It must provide crucial information necessary to understand how Asian and Pacific American students learn, how educational practitioners should work with Asian and Pacific American students, and the outcomes we can expect from various programs in Asian and Pacific American education. Given a dearth of published research about Asian and Pacific American education, the series intend to be a national voice for the education of Asian and Pacific Americans, and provide an integrated view of new knowledge in the field of Asian and Pacific American education from scholar-practitioners' perspectives. The topic of your research paper is open as long as it addresses the educational issues of Asian and Pacific Americans.

Guidelines for Submission

1. You must carefully follow the instructions in the Publication Manual of the of the American Psychological Association (1994, 4th Edition);
2. Your paper must be no more than 30 pages (double-spaced) including tables and bibliography;
3. You must submit 3 clean copies, a diskette for Microsoft Word (for IBM PC, with the number of words and your name on it); and an abstract (3 copies of 100 words), and a short biographical sketch (5 sentences);
4. The cover page of your paper must include your affiliation, address, phone number, and e-mail address. (Please do not put these on the first page of your paper. Your paper will get a blind review.)
5. You must send your paper with a diskette by no later than September 15, 2003.
