The recent resignation of Australia's Kevin Rudd as foreign minister, and his subsequent parliamentary challenge to Prime Minister Julia Gillard, underscore the fascinating political dynamics currently at play within Australia's political system. As one of America's closest allies and a major influence in the Pacific islands region, what does this mean for the Australian policy in Asia Pacific? The roundtable discussion will provide an overview of the current political climate in Australia as well as observations from long-time observers of Australia's current affairs.
