
The Hajj and Malcolm X A Lecture by Dr. Abdul-Karim Khan

On 13 April 1964, civil rights leader Malcolm X left New York City to begin the Hajj, the pilgrimage to Mecca required of all able-bodied Muslims. As Malcolm X would later note in several speeches and in his autobiography, the Hajj would represent a watershed moment in his life—an experience that would move him spiritually but which would also profoundly transform his understanding and views of racial politics in the United States and around the world.
