Dr. Berry is a scholar of national and international standing in the area of child welfare. She has served as the Director of the Australian Centre for Child Protection at the University of South Australia; Director of the Office of Child Welfare Research and Development, School of Social Welfare at the University of Kansas; and Co-founder and Director of the Center for Child Welfare, School of Social Work at the University of Texas at Arlington. She was a professor at the aforementioned universities and taught at both the graduate and undergraduate levels in children and family services, child welfare policy, family preservation practice, and research methods. Dr. Berry has written or edited four books; authored or co-authored 25 book chapters, 52 peer-reviewed journal articles, and numerous research reports; and served as a guest editor for three academic journals. Dr. Berry is experienced in conducting translational research and developing outreach programs including the design of evidence-based curriculum and practices, program evaluation, and workforce training. Her research and outreach extension work has been funded by foundations and government agencies in the U.S. and overseas.
