Elizabeth Becker

A journalist and author who began her career as a war correspondent for the *Washington Post* in Cambodia, became the Senior Foreign Editor of National Public Radio and later a *New York Times* correspondent covering national security, foreign policy, agriculture and international economics. She is the author of *You Don't Belong Here: How Three Women Rewrote the Story of War*, winner of Harvard's 2022 Goldsmith Book Award.

Denby Fawcett

A veteran newspaper and television journalist. She was a Knight Journalism Fellow at Stanford University and has been inducted into the Associated Press Television Radio Association's Hall of Fame for a lifetime of achievement. She co-authored *War Torn: Stories of War from the Women Reporters Who Covered Vietnam*, a book about her and eight other women reporters who covered the Vietnam War.

Beverly Deepe Kever

A professor emerita of UH Mānoa. As a journalist, she covered the Vietnam War for seven years for publications such as *Newsweek*, the *New York Herald Tribune* and the *Christian Science Monitor*. Her coverage of the besieged outpost of Khe Sanh in 1968 was nominated for a Pulitzer Prize in international reporting. She is the author of *Death Zones* and *Darling Spies: Seven Years of Vietnam War Reporting*.
