Full-time Internships

U.S. Congress in Washington, D.C. | Dept. of the Honolulu Prosecuting Attorney | Office of the Hawai'i Public Defender | Hawai'i State Legislature

Interns will work 35-40 hours per week. Full-time awards cover 12 credits of resident tuition at UH Mānoa for the semester. Congressional internship award includes additional funding for travel and housing in Washington, D.C.

Full-time interns will be required to enroll in the appropriate seminar course: POLS 408 (Congressional Fellowship) or POLS 405 (Executive Internship) for 6 credits. All full-time interns will also be required to enroll in POLS 386 (Public Policy-Making) for 3 credits and a Directed Reading/Research course for 3 credits.

Part-time Internships

Local Offices of Hawai'i's Congressional Delegation

Interns will work 10-15 hours per week. Part-time awards include a small stipend.

Part-time interns will be required to enroll in POLS 403 (Community Internship) for 3 credits.

Eligibility Requirements

Full-time undergraduate enrollment at UH Mānoa with a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0. Minimum junior standing by the Spring 2023 semester for full-time internships, and minimum sophomore standing for part-time internships. Students of *all majors* are welcome to apply!
