Ancestral Archipelagos: Stories of I Mañaina with Dr. Tiara Na'puti

Dr. Na'puti is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Global and International Studies in the School of Social Sciences at the University of California, Irvine. A Chamoru scholar (Guåhan/Guam), Dr. Naputi's research focuses on issues of Indigenous movements, colonialism, and militarism in the Mariana Islands archipelago. In 2021-2022 she was the recipient of a Mellon/ACLS Scholars and Society Fellowship, which she used to work with Independent Guåhan educating the island's public about sovereignty. Dr. Naputi's recent publications appear in *Security Dialogue*, *Environmental Communication*, and *Communication and Critical/Cultural Studies*. She has also published in outlets such as *CommonDreams*, *In These Times*, *Pacific Island Times*, and *Latinx Spaces*.
