- Awards up to 10 grants worth \$2,000 each year
- Deadline is October 15th (notification by December 15th)

Education Testing Service (ETS): TOEFL Young Students Research Program – Graduate Student Research Grants

- Awards up to \$5,000 for graduate projects
- Emphasis on young learners in English as a foreign language contexts

Fulbright-Hays--Doctoral Dissertation Research Abroad

- Projects deepen research knowledge on and help the nation develop capability in areas of the world not generally included in U.S. curricula (projects based in Western Europe not accepted)

- Funds projects abroad for between 6-12 months
- Must apply through institution

The International Research Foundation (TIRF) of English Language Education: Doctoral Dissertation Grants

- Awards up to \$5,000 for dissertation research
- Deadline generally in late-April, notification in August

- Supports basic science in the domain of human language, encompassing investigations of the grammatical properties of individual human languages, and of natural language in general
- Not for research into developing tools for assessing and teaching languages

- Must be a member of AAAL

International Language Testing Association (ILTA) Student Travel Award

- To support graduate students in attending and presenting at annual LTRC Conference
- Up to \$750 + 1 year membership in ILTA; number varies by year
- Deadline generally early December – early January
